



#### Real Value of U.S. Highway & Street Construction Work – Rolling 12-month Totals

#### Real Value of U.S. Bridge Construction Work – Rolling 12-month Totals






#### Real Value of Transit Construction Work, Rolling 12-month Totals



# Federal funds, on average, provide 51% of annual State DOT capital outlays for highway & bridge projects











# Federal Highway Program Obligation Limitation Under FAST Act, Annual Appropriations and Senate ATIA Proposal





#### State Highway & Bridge Program Revenue Mix Has Changed








#### 2019: 18 States Propose a State Fuel Tax Increase




# 2019: 15 States Propose New/Adjusted Variable-Rate Gas Taxes











#### **States Approving Transportation Funding Legislation 2015-2019**























#### California Helps Drive Monthly Contract Awards Up 25 Percent

Led by an increase in rail and transit awards in Calif the total value of state and local government transportation contract awards increased 25 percei \$8.7 billion in July of 2018 to \$10.9 billion in July of 2

Monthly awards were up for airports (+7%) and doo piers and wharves (+4%).

Rail and transit awards increased from \$125 million 2018 to \$3 billion in July 2019.

Bridge and tunnel awards fell from \$2 billion to \$1.5 billion, and highway contract awards were down sli from \$5.9 billion in July 2018 to \$5.8 billion in July 2 decline of 2 percent.

It is not uncommon for award levels to fluctuate fro month to month or year to year, since large project increase totals in a given time frame.

Year to date (YTD), total contract awards are running behind last year's pace, but still above averages for to 2017.

States awarded \$54.6 billion in transportation conti awards between January and July 2018, compared t average of \$46.9 billion in the same time period for to 2017, an increase of 14 percent.

Several states had award levels in 2018 above avera including California, Maccachucatte, Naw York and 3
